- Encourage local authorities and mediation services to inform the public of services available
- Educate and inform noise makers and noise sufferers about noise reduction
- Encourage everyone to take a quiet moment to consider the noises they make and the noise that affects them - and what can be done to reduce the impact

Public and Environmental Protection Team



The Team cover all types of noise. Most noise will be dealt with using the Environmental Protection Act 1990 but some noise, like Construction sites or ice-cream van chimes, can be dealt with using the Control of Pollution Act 1974. Examples of the types of noise we investigate are:

- Noise from private houses
- Barking dogs
- Loudspeakers
- Factory noise
- Quarries and mines
- Shops, supermarkets, takeaways and restaurants
- Farm noise including bird scarers
- Road and rail works
- Racetracks
- Intruder alarms

The team also comments on Planning Applications and advises the Licensing board.

By our definition, being anti social is behaving in a way which causes, or is likely to cause, alarm and distress to others.

- Persistent excessive noise
- Physical assault
- Verbal abuse
- Racial harassment
- Loud Music
